Unibz presenta annualmente la candidatura per poter partecipare all'Azione Chiave 1 del Programma Erasmus+/Mobilità che prevede la possibilità di finanziare per studenti e docenti mobilità di breve durata nell'ambito di "Blended Intensive Programmes/BIP" e "Short Mobility Initiatives".

Published by Rector's Decree

Short mobilities and Blended Intensive Programmes (BIPs) are among the new and innovative formats introduced under the Erasmus+ 2021–2027 Programme. Designed jointly by several higher education institutions across Europe, these programmes use advanced and innovative teaching approaches that combine short, in-person (physical) mobility with online learning components.

Short mobilities are by nature **transnational** and **transdisciplinary**, as curricula are co-designed and co-taught by partner universities in different countries. By blending physical and virtual learning environments, students and academic staff can engage in highly collaborative, challenge-based, and research-informed teaching and learning activities.

The mandatory virtual component also allows students to develop and strengthen their digital skills—supporting the European Commission's priority to harness digital technologies for education and ensure that all learners can acquire relevant digital competences.

1. Programmes and Total Number of Participants

unibz offers its students and teaching staff the opportunity to take part in Short Mobility Programmes. This call concerns participation in the **physical mobility** component of the programmes listed below:

PLEASE NOTE that unibz students who already attended the BIP in Lisbon in 2025 are not eligible for this same BIP.

In addition to the student grants listed above, **one teaching staff mobility grant** is available for the BIP in Portugal.

2. Financial Support

A financial contribution is provided to support the physical mobility period included in the programme.

Students

The contribution is awarded to all selected students who complete both the physical and virtual components of the programme.

Individual support grant:

- From Day 1 to Day 14 of mobility: **€79 per day**

Additional contributions will be awarded for:

- **travel**
- **green travel if relevant**
- **inclusiveness support if relevant**

Further details will be provided directly by unibz to selected students.

Students with special needs linked to health conditions may receive additional support funded by the European Union. Availability of such grants will be communicated individually to selected participants.

Grants may be revoked and refunded in the following cases:

- Withdrawal from the short mobility period (physical and/or virtual)
- Cancellation of the mobility period by unibz and/or the partner university due to non-compliance by the student with the mobility agreement
- Failure to obtain a minimum of **3 ECTS**

Teaching Staff

For the financial contribution (amounts, duration, teaching hours, and limitations), all Erasmus+ rules apply.

All expenses must comply with current unibz regulations on missions/business trips and must be properly documented.

3. Eligibility Criteria

Students

Participation is open to students enrolled in:

- **Master in Industrial Mechanical Engineering (LM-33)**

To be eligible for short-term physical mobility, students must consider the maximum number of Erasmus mobility months available per study cycle:

- **Cycle I and II (Bachelor and Master): 12 months in total**

Additional notes:

- Students may carry out more than one Erasmus+ mobility (Study, Traineeship, or Short Mobility/BIP) in the same academic year, as long as the periods **do not overlap**.
- The virtual component of this call is compatible with other international mobility programmes (including Erasmus+).

Teaching Staff

Eligible applicants are **teaching staff from the Master in Industrial Mechanical Engineering (LM-33)** of the Faculty of Engineering who will carry out teaching activities agreed with the partner institution and documented in accordance with Erasmus+ regulations within the BIP covered by this call.

4. Selection Criteria and Procedures

Selections will be carried out by a Committee composed of:

Prof. Yuri Borgianni, Prof. Franco Concli and Dr. Aurora Berni

Student Selection Criteria:

1. Bachelor's degree final grade – **50%**
2. Motivation letter – **50%**

Priority will be given to students who have not yet benefited from an Erasmus mobility scholarship. Those who have already received an Erasmus mobility scholarship will be ranked after the other eligible applicants.

Teaching Staff Selection Criteria:

1. Overall objectives of the mobility and content of the teaching programme – **max 40 points**
 2. Curriculum and teaching qualifications, considering career stage – **max 40 points**
 3. Priority given to staff applying for Erasmus mobility for the first time – **max 20 points**

Applicants may apply for more than one mobility programme included in this call, indicating their order of preference.

The ranking lists will be published by **19 December 2025**.

Selected students and staff must confirm acceptance or submit their withdrawal **within 2 working days** of publication of the ranking list, by following the instructions provided by unibz. Failure to accept within the deadline will result in **automatic exclusion**.

Vacant places will be reassigned by moving down the ranking list. Notification will be sent exclusively to the institutional email address of candidates called as replacements.

6. Recognition of Mobility

Students

The blended international mobility period is fully recognised as part of the student's academic pathway, based on what is agreed in advance by the student's Faculty and the host university through the **Learning Agreement for Studies**.

Successful completion of the programme (physical + virtual components) grants **at least 3 ECTS**.

Students must submit:

- The final **"After the Mobility"** document, including learning outcomes, awarded credits, and certified dates of the physical mobility period.

Teaching Staff

At the end of the mobility, teaching staff must submit documentation certifying the teaching hours delivered.

7. Privacy Policy

This information complements the privacy notice provided under Article 13 of EU Regulation 679/2016 at the time of enrolment at the Free University of Bozen-Bolzano. All personal data collected for this selection procedure are treated in compliance with applicable data protection regulations.

Personal data required for the publication of the ranking list, including the points achieved, will be published in the university's online Study Guide.
