



## ADDITIONAL FUNDING

The European Union can allocate additional 250 € per month to students coming from disadvantaged socio-economic situations. Further information will be made available when the financial agreement is signed. Please note that beneficiaries of a grant from the Autonomous Province of Bozen-Bolzano cannot access additional funding for disadvantaged socio-economic situations.

The EU provides additional funding: - 250,00€ top up per month if you come from one of the backgrounds which the Erasmus programme considers to be disadvantaged:

- you come from a migrant background and/or you are a refugee;
- you have a child under the age of 18;
- you carry out a continuous work activity in parallel with your study programme;
- you are a professional athlete;
- you are orphan of at least one parent;
- you are the child of parent(s) who were victims of terrorism or organized crime;
- you suffer from serious physical and/or mental health conditions/impairments that you can document by medical certification;
- you are in an economically disadvantaged situation that you can document by submitting your ISEE (If you intend to request the additional EU grant for this reason, please note that, if you receive a scholarship from the Autonomous Province of Bozen/Bolzano, this is not compatible).

## **GREEN MOBILITY**

**50.00€ top up** if you travel in a green and sustainable way (train, bus, car sharing) to your Erasmus exchange destination (outbound and/or inbound trip).

The Erasmus programme invites students in mobility to opt for environmentally sustainable travel, i.e. by train or low-emission bus (e.g. FlixBus). In this case, they can receive a flat-rate EU contribution of EUR 50 as a supplement to their Erasmus grant. The payment of the contribution is subject to the verification of the travel document/ticket which the student must forward to the International Relations Office upon return from the Erasmus mobility.
