L'Erasmus Charter for Higher Education prevede la partecipazione della Libera Università di Bolzano al programma Erasmus+ 2021-27.

Unibz presenta annualmente la candidatura per poter partecipare all'Azione Chiave 1 del Programma Erasmus+/Mobilità che prevede la possibilità di finanziare per studenti e docenti mobilità di breve durata nell'ambito di "Blended Intensive Programmes/BIP" e "Short Mobility Initiatives".

L'Agenzia Nazionale Erasmus+ raccomanda che la selezione dei candidati alla mobilità Erasmus+ sia trasparente e prevenga qualsiasi potenziale conflitto di interesse.

Con provvedimento d'urgenza nr. 10 del 23.04.2025 il Preside della Facoltà di Ingegneria ha approvato la Commissione di valutazione e i criteri di selezione degli studenti che intendono candidarsi per il Blended Intensive Programme di cui all'oggetto.

ERASMUS+ CALL FOR APPLICATIONS for SHORT MOBILITIES / BIPs

Published by Rector's Decree

Short mobilities and BIPs (Blended Intensive Programmes) are one of the new and innovative formats of student mobility introduced by the new Erasmus+ 2021-2027 Programme. These programmes, jointly developed by multiple higher education institutions, feature advanced and innovative pedagogical approaches that combine short-term face-to-face (physical) mobilities with portions of virtual learning.

These short mobilities are inherently transnational and transdisciplinary, as curricula are developed and taught together by partner institutions in different countries. The combination of in-person and virtual learning spaces allows students and professors to experience and exchange highly collaborative, challenge-based, and research- steeped methods of teaching and learning.

Through the required virtual part of the programme, students can develop and hone their digital knowledge and skills, reflecting the European Commission's priority to harness the potential of digital technologies for teaching and learning and to develop digital skills for all.

1. Programme(s) and total number of participants

unibz offers its students (and teaching staff) the opportunity to participate in Short Mobility Programmes. This selection refers to the physical participation for the programme(s):

 Universitat Jaume 1 (Spain): Creative product design: towards a more sustainable society through research

> Admitted students: 4 Physical mobility 9-13.06.2025

Virtual mobility: 13-15.05.25; 22.05.2025

2. Financial support

In order to support the period of physical mobility carried out within the program, a financial contribution is provided.

The contribution is addressed to all students admitted to the program who will complete the planned physical and virtual mobility.

Individual support

From the 1st until the 14th day of mobility: 79 euro per day

The grant shall be supplemented by specific contributions to support travel costs and inclusiveness (where conditions apply). Further information will be forwarded by unibz to the winners of mobility.

Grants received may be subject to refund in the event of:

- renunciation of the short mobility period (physical and/or virtual)





- cancellation of the mobility period by unibz and/or the partner university due to the student's failure to comply with the provisions of the mobility agreement.
- failure to achieve a minimum of 3 ECTS

3. Eligibility criteria

Participation to the programme(s) is open to students of the following disciplines and/or degree programmes:

Master in Industrial Mechanical Engineering (LM-33)

To be eligible for short-term physical mobility, it is necessary to consider the maximum number of Erasmus mobility days available for each study cycle, detailed below:

- Cycle I and II (bachelor and Master): 12 months
- single-cycle degree: 24 months

It is also specified that:

- It is possible to carry out, in the same academic year but not at the same time, one or more Erasmus mobility activities abroad (Study, Traineeship or short mobility/BIP);
- Virtual mobility covered by this Call for Applications is, however, compatible with other international mobility programmes (including Erasmus).

4. Selection criteria and procedures

An appointed Committee formed by Prof. Borgianni Yuri, Dr. Molinaro Margherita, Dr. Berni Aurora, substitute Prof. Guido Orzes, will carry out the selection procedures.

Selection criteria for students:

- 1. ECTS achieved: the total number of credits will be divided by the number of credits foreseen in the study plan (30%)
- 2. Grade average (30%)
- 3. Motivation letter (40%).

Minimum score to enter the ranking 60 points.

Priority will be given to students who have not benefitted so far from an Erasmus short mobility/ BIP programme. Those who have already benefitted from an Erasmus short mobility/ BIP programme abroad will be ranked after the other eligible ones.

5. How to apply

Students interested in participating must fill out the **application form** at: https://forms.office.com/e/uK5kF8aiTn by **4 May 2025**.

The application form must contain the following attachments:

Motivation letter

The rankings will be drawn up by the appointed Commission and sent by email by **9 May 2025**. Winning students must accept/renounce the mobility through the online procedure (or through any other duly communicated procedure) within 5 days from the publication of the ranking list, following the





instructions that will be provided by unibz.

Successful candidates who do not sign their acceptance by the established deadline will be automatically excluded from the rankings, as ex officio renounced for the present Call.

Vacancies not filled due to non-acceptance or renunciation shall be assigned through the sliding of the ranking list. In this case, the mobility assignment shall be notified to the eligible candidates called as replacement only through a communication to the institutional e-mail address.

6. Recognition of the mobility

The period of international mobility, carried out in its blended mode, is an integral part of the educational pathway and enjoys full academic recognition, on the basis of what has been agreed in advance with the student's Faculty and with the host university through the Learning Agreement for Studies (study plan for the mobility period).

The training activity carried out within the Erasmus short mobility must be recognized within the academic career at unibz through the compilation of the "Learning Agreement for Studies".

The successful completion of the programme, both in its physical and virtual parts, awards at least 3 ECTS.

For the purposes of recognition, each student is required to:

- submit the relevant documentation attesting the activity carried out (final "After the mobility" document containing the learning outcomes, credits awarded and the dates of the period of physical mobility certified by the partner university).

7. Privacy policy

This information is to be considered as an integration of the note provided in compliance with art. 13 of EU Regulation 679 / 2016 - Data Protection Code (DPC) - at the time of enrollment at the Free University of Bozen-Bolzano which is recalled here in full. Your personal data, collected today for the completion of the selection procedure and possibly additional to those provided at the time of enrollment at the University, are treated in compliance with the aforementioned regulation as well as with current regulations. As a participant in the selection process, your personal data necessary for the publication of the ranking will be published in the online Study Guide of the university together with the ranking points you achieved.
